Names of Assam & Ancient (Pragjyotisha)

Name	Period / source
Pragjyotisha	Earliest name (Mahabharata, Ramayana). King Bhagadatta fought for the Kauravas.
Kamarupa	Ancient-early medieval kingdom; named in the Allahabad Pillar inscription.
Kamata / Kamatapur	Late-medieval western Assam kingdom.
Asom / Assam	From the Ahoms (Tai); anglicised to 'Assam' by the British.

Kamarupa Kingdom - 3 dynasties

Dynasty	Founder	Greatest king	Capital
Varman	Pushyavarman	Bhaskaravarman	Pragjyotishpura (Guwahati)
Salastambha (Mlechchha)	Salastambha	Harjaravarman	Haruppeswara (Tezpur)
Pala	Brahmapala	Dharmapala	Durjaya (North Guwahati)

- Bhaskaravarman: greatest Varman king; ally of Harshavardhana; hosted the Chinese pilgrim Hiuen Tsang; issued the Nidhanpur copper-plate.

Ahom Dynasty (1228-1826) - timeline

1228	● Chaolung Sukaphaa founds the Ahom kingdom; first capital Charaideo.
1497-1539	● Suhungmung (Dihingia Raja), title Swarganarayan; kingdom expands.
1603-1641	● Pratap Singha - posts of Barbarua & Barphukan; Paik system organised.
1671	● Battle of Saraighat - Lachit Borphukan defeats the Mughals (Ram Singh I) on the Brahmaputra.
1696-1714	● Rudra Singha - zenith of Ahom power; capital Rangpur.
1769-1805	● Moamoria Rebellion weakens the kingdom.
1826	● Treaty of Yandabo - Assam ceded to the British; Ahom rule ends.

- Ahom administration: Paik system (labour/military service); Great Gohains - Burhagohain, Borgohain, Borpatra Gohain; Buranjis = Ahom chronicles.
- Sivasagar monuments: Rang Ghar (royal pavilion/amphitheatre), Talatal Ghar, Kareng Ghar, Sivadol.

British Assam

- 1826** ● Treaty of Yandabo - Assam under the British; David Scott, first administrator.
- 1839** ● Assam Company formed - first tea company in India.
- 1874** ● Assam made a separate Chief Commissioner's province (capital Shillong).
- 1905** ● Partition of Bengal - 'Eastern Bengal and Assam' province (capital Dacca).
- 1912** ● Partition annulled; Assam reverts to a Chief Commissioner's province.

- Maniram Dewan - first Assamese tea planter; hanged in 1858 (with Piyali Barua) for the Revolt of 1857.

Freedom Movement & Assam Movement

Martyr / leader	Year	Remembered for
Kanaklata Barua	1942	Shot at Gohpur carrying the national flag (aged 17).
Kushal Konwar	1943	Only person hanged in the Quit India Movement (Sarupathar case).
Bhogeswari Phukanani	1942	Woman martyr, shot at Berhampur (Nagaon).
Gopinath Bordoloi	-	First CM of Assam; 'Lokpriya'; Bharat Ratna (1999).

- Assam Movement (1979-1985): anti-illegal-immigrant agitation led by AASU + AAGSP; ended with the Assam Accord (1985); cut-off date 24 March 1971; led to the formation of the AGP (Prafulla Kumar Mahanta became CM).

Most Asked Facts

- Sukaphaa founded the Ahoms in 1228; Battle of Saraighat (1671) = Lachit Borphukan.
- Treaty of Yandabo (1826) ended Ahom rule. Assam Company (1839) = first tea company.
- Kushal Konwar = only martyr hanged in Quit India. Gopinath Bordoloi = first CM, Bharat Ratna.

SECTION 2

Assam Geography

Location & boundaries

- Area: about 78,438 sq km (~2.4% of India); in the North-East, mostly the Brahmaputra & Barak valleys.
- Borders seven Indian states: Arunachal Pradesh, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram, Tripura, Meghalaya and West Bengal.
- Shares international borders with Bhutan and Bangladesh.
- The Tropic of Cancer does NOT pass through Assam.

Physical divisions, districts & hills

- Three physiographic units: the Brahmaputra Valley (north), the Barak Valley (south: Cachar, Karimganj, Hailakandi) and the hills (Karbi Anglong & Dima Hasao).
- Administered through 5 divisions (Lower Assam, Upper Assam, North Assam, Central Assam, Hills & Barak Valley); the number of districts is reorganised periodically (currently in the mid-30s).
- Karbi Anglong is the largest district by area; capital Dispur lies in Kamrup Metropolitan district.
- Barail Range = the highest hill range in Assam (separates the Brahmaputra and Barak basins).

Rivers & tributaries

- Brahmaputra: Tsangpo (Tibet) -> Siang/Dihang (Arunachal) -> enters Assam near Sadiya; a braided, 'male' river.
- Barak: rises in Manipur, drains the Barak Valley, then splits into the Surma and Kushiya in Bangladesh (Meghna system).

North bank	Subansiri (largest), Jia Bharali (Kameng), Manas, Sankosh, Puthimari, Pagladiya, Beki
South bank	Burhi Dihing, Disang, Dikhow, Dhansiri, Kopili

Climate, agriculture & resources

- Climate: tropical monsoon - hot wet summers, heavy SW-monsoon rainfall, severe Brahmaputra floods; 'Bordoisila' = pre-monsoon storms.
- Agriculture: rice is the staple/dominant crop; commercial crops - tea, jute, mustard, sugarcane.
- Natural resources: petroleum & natural gas (Digboi, Naharkatiya, Moran, Rudrasagar), coal (Makum coalfield, Tinsukia), limestone (Dima Hasao).

Most Asked Facts

- Assam borders 7 states + Bhutan & Bangladesh; Tropic of Cancer does NOT pass through it.
- Subansiri = largest tributary (north bank). Brahmaputra enters Assam at Sadiya.
- Majuli = India's first river-island district (2016).

- Barak Valley = Cachar + Karimganj + Hailakandi.
- South-bank tributaries: Burhi Dihing, Disang, Dikhow, Dhansiri, Kopili.
- Digboi/Naharkatiya = oilfields; Makum = coalfield.

Designations

- UNESCO World Heritage Sites (natural): Kaziranga and Manas (both 1985).
- Biosphere Reserves: Manas and Dibru-Saikhowa.
- Ramsar Site (wetland of international importance): Deepor Beel (near Guwahati) - the only Ramsar site in Assam.
- Key sanctuaries: Pobitora (highest rhino density, 'mini Kaziranga'); Hoollongapar Gibbon Sanctuary (hoolock gibbon - India's only ape).

Bhogali / Magh	January	Harvest; feasting (Meji, community feasts)
Kongali / Kati	October	Austere; lamp-lighting (Tulsi); lean season

Vaishnavism, Sattras & Sattriya

- Srimanta Sankardeva (1449-1568): founded the Ekasarana Dharma (Neo-Vaishnavism); created Borgeet (devotional songs), Ankia Naat (one-act plays) and Bhaona; established the Sattras and Namghar institutions. Chief disciple: Madhavdeva (Naam Ghosa).
- Sattriya: a classical dance of India, developed in the Sattras of Assam.
- Majuli is the great centre of Sattras (monastic) culture.
- Music: Borgeet and Bihu songs; Zikir and Zari (Sufi songs of Azan Fakir / Ajan Pir).

Attire & temples

- Traditional attire: Mekhela Chador (women); the Gamosa (handwoven cloth) received a GI tag.
- Kamakhya Temple (Nilachal Hill, Guwahati) - a Shakti Peetha; hosts the Ambubachi Mela.
- Me-Dam-Me-Phi (31 January) - Ahom ancestor-worship festival.

Most Asked Facts

- Sankardeva = Ekasarana Dharma, Borgeet, Ankia Naat, Sattras; Sattriya is a classical dance.
- Three Bihus: Rongali (April), Bhogali (Jan), Kongali (Oct).
- Bodo = largest tribe; Mising festival = Ali-Aye-Ligang.

Assam Economy

Tea industry

- Assam is the largest tea-producing state in India (about half of national output).
- Tocklai Tea Research Institute (Jorhat) - among the oldest and largest tea research stations.
- Guwahati Tea Auction Centre - one of the largest CTC tea auction centres.

Oil & natural gas

- Digboi - site of one of Asia's oldest oil refineries (commissioned 1901) and India's early oil industry.
- Refineries: Digboi, Guwahati/Noonmati (first public-sector refinery, 1962), Bongaigaon and Numaligarh.
- Oil India Limited is headquartered at Duliajan; ONGC also operates in Assam.

Silk, agriculture, tourism & industry

Sector	Key facts
Silk	Muga (golden, GI), Pat (white) and Eri; Sualkuchi is the weaving hub
Agriculture	Rice (staple); tea, jute, mustard, sugarcane
Tourism	Kaziranga, Majuli, Kamakhya, Sivasagar (Ahom monuments)
Industries	Tea, petroleum/refining, plywood, paper, cement, handloom

- Assam = largest tea-producing state. Digboi = oldest refinery (1901).
